U.S. Air Force's Newest 'Rock' Star Flies to Arkansas

MARIETTA, Ga., May 15, 2014 – The 61st Airlift Squadron at <u>Little Rock Air Force Base</u>, Arkansas, received another <u>C-130J Super Hercules</u> airlifter on May 15.

<u>Lt. Gen. Brooks Bash</u>, vice commander, Air Mobility Command, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois, ferried the aircraft from the Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Co., facility in Marietta, Ga. Bash is a command pilot who has logged more than 6,500 flight hours throughout his career.

The 61st, which has operated C-130s since 1956, is part of <u>Air Mobility Command's</u> 19th Airlift Wing.
